Academics, teachers, MA & PhD students, researchers, experts & practitioners in the field of Language Teaching, are cordially invited to submit papers for the CyTEA Annual Conference 2018, **Embracing change in ELT: Challenges and Perspectives**, Nicosia, Cyprus, 8-9 December 2018, which will be under the support of IATEFL LT SIG and Cyprus Educational Association (Εκπαιδευτικός Όμιλος Κύπρου).

The role of Language Learning in today's globalized world is an undeniable fact which has accelerated the demand and the need to improve the quality of teaching and learning in language teaching classrooms alongside rapid advances in technology. Final Abstract Submission Deadline: September 3, 2018

We solicit papers on all areas of interest to the Language Learning community and aligned fields, including but not limited to the following themes:

- Foreign Language Teacher Education
- EFL theories and research (productive and receptive skills, linguistic and communicative competences, code-switching, classroom interaction analysis, assessment and evaluation, curriculum development)
- ICT in Language Teaching
- Psychological and psycholinguistic perspectives in EFL / ELT (attitudinal patterns, motivation, individual learner differences, learning strategies, learner autonomy)
- Content and Language Integrated Learning (CLIL) + Content and Language Integrated Learning
- Multilingualism / bilingualism
- Discourse analysis
- Educational language policies
- Learning at a distance
- Gaming and Gamification
- Innovative teaching methodologies
- New approaches to teacher training

Other themes relevant to language learning can also be considered.

The conference aims to offer both academic papers as well as insights from practitioners and practical workshops. Proposals are accepted in the following presentation formats:

Paper: (30 minutes) – This presentation format includes talks which discuss and describe work related to theory, research or practice (20 min presentation with 10 min for discussion).

Workshop: (1 hour) – This presentation format is aimed to give presenters a chance to share ideas, thoughts, techniques and/or materials in an interactive way.

Poster: - This presentation format can be used to visually display a research project, a recommended technique or other innovative ideas and suggestions.

Working language: The conference working language will be English. No translation will be provided.

Conference selections

- Papers must not exceed 1000 words in length including figures and references.
- They must be interesting and/or relevant to readers outside your immediate context.
- They should have the format of a paper – avoid the use of bullets as they appear on PowerPoint slides.
- They must not be sent in PDF format and must not contain headers, footers or page numbers.
